Rehab (Short Term Rehabilitation) – What is short term rehab care?

Rehabilitation helps an individual regain physical or mental abilities that have been impaired or lost due to illness or injury.

1. How does the facility communicate with families about a resident's well-being?
2. What is the ratio of staff to residents during the day/night?
3. What is the average length of stay?
4. How will progress be recorded and tracked?
5. Is there a continuum of care?
6. How many hours of therapy a day will there be?
7. Is the facility experienced in treating your loved one's condition?
8. What insurances are accepted?

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Memory Care – What is memory care?
